What Kuo Makes: Bright, impressively sized "color chart" paintings and smaller, quieter self-portraits. Hand-screened T-shirts, often incorporating '90s bands (Superchunk, Bone Thugs-N-Harmony), Budweiser ("There Will Be Bud"), or the NBA (James Harden and Jeremy Lin as Beavis and Butt-head).

His Chops: Rhode Island School of Design; then, in 1999, moved to Lower Manhattan, where he worked as an illustrator.

The Work: Kuo's recent show _You Say Tomato _focused on his razor-sharp, opulent color charts (see \#3 above). While at first they might seem like purely visual explorations, a closer look reveals they're actually more like "emotion charts"-each piece is Kuo's carefully plotted attempt to map his feelings. We follow along via a key: One color represents the thought "I like the idea of people, but not the idea of spending time with them." Another corresponds to "My waking life is bookended by two beers."


Kuo On Painting Himself: "I'm usually making these geometric paintings, but I hate to waste paint. So I keep a canvas next to me that I use to wipe my brushes. Slowly the wipes morphed into their own thing-thoughts piling up-and, being the egomaniac I am, I started adding a pair of glasses, so they became self-portraits."
**Get a Kuo in Your Life: **At Marlborough Chelsea, color charts range from \$15K to \$50K; smaller paintings are about \$4K. Or just follow him on Instagram (@earlboykins), where he posts zany found photos, often of pets. Also:
